halter & lead under the bridle. Halter rope to handler, bridle
reins to rider.

GAMES - (Lead Line riders may participate in Game #1 only.)
**All Junior riders MUST wear a helmet in
Games. Helmets advised for Adults.**

CARMEL VALLEY TRAIL & SADDLE CLUB rules apply to all: members, contestants and guests. Contestants are responsible for their guests. Please help them observe the rules.

Drive slowly on Club grounds: 3 mph. Please space your rigs so others can tie their horses safely to their trailers. **Walk your horses at all times in the parking lot.** If there is a horse/rider accident or loose horse, **do not run your horse** to the scene. This could cause another accident.

NO HORSES ON THE LAWN OR GRASS AREAS. PLEASE KEEP HORSES AWAY FROM SNACK BAR, BBQ AND CLUB HOUSE.

Please warm-up or ride ONLY in designated horse areas. NO SLIDES or SPINS in DRESSAGE RING. DO NOT RIDE OVER RAILS IN THE DRIVING RING. If you see a rail down, please set it up on the stand. Thank you in advance for being Caring Western Riders.

When mounted or around horses, Novice riders must be attended by a knowledgeable adult. Children must be supervised at all times. While having fun, let's be safe.

RIDING DIVISIONS:

JUNIOR BEGINNER - just learning to ride or show: walk & jog.

Ground helper may enter arena to assist.

JUNIOR INTERMEDIATE - walk, jog & lope: still learning leads.

JUNIOR ADVANCED - walk, jog & lope. Might be on young mounts, but riders are of advanced skill level.

ADULT: ALL RIDERS 18 & OVER - walk, jog & lope.

We try to keep class sizes to 15 riders or less. If necessary,

Management will split a Division into group #1 & #2.

MANAGEMENT DECISIONS ARE FINAL.

LEAD LINE is FREE to riders age 6 & under whose Parent has signed Show Release. L L riders can only compete in Lead Line and Game #1.

REQUIRED GEAR: Riding boots with a heel, a long sleeved collared shirt and long pants. **Helmets are advised for all riders.**

WEARING A HELMET IS A REQUIREMENT FOR ALL JUNIOR RIDERS IN GAMES AND GYMKHANAS.

This is a schooling show. Most humane training aids or gimmick tack are acceptable. Attire and appointments not to count. Check "Show Rules" before showing at other shows; their rules may be different.

LOOSE DOGS ARE NOT ALLOWED. ALL PETS MUST BE ON LEASH.
